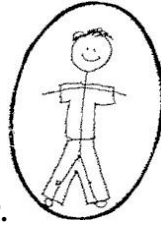
All items lost at camp will be held at the front desk area.

Dress casual. Jeans and a t-shirt.



Shorts are great too!



Girls can wear dresses or skirts if they want to.



Please no tight shirts, sweaters, pants or shorts. That goes for girls and boys. Girls, no bare midriffs or short shorts.



No short skirts or low-cut tops. No inappropriate slogans on clothing. Boys - rear view - keep your pants pulled up.



Boys and Girls are recommended to wear closed-toe shoes.

Common sense in dress will make camp a better experience.

## Discipline Policy

TeenPreneur Foundation holds safety and positive atmosphere for learning and developing social skills as top objectives in all programming. TeenPreneur Foundation makes every effort to help children understand the clear definitions of acceptable and unacceptable behavior.

| <b>TeenPreneur Foundation does not condone or permit:</b>  | <b>Children's behavior should be consistent with the following:</b>  |

| Corporal punishment, Ridiculing, threatening, or yelling (inappropriately loud voice)<br>Leaving children unsupervised<br>Use of profanity | Appropriate language at all times<br>Cooperate with staff and follow directions<br>Respect other children, staff, equipment, facilities and oneself<br>Maintain positive attitude<br>Stay in program areas in view of counselors |

- If a child is unable to comply with behavior expectations after several attempts to correct behavior by camp leaders/counselors, the child will meet with the program director and parents/guardians will be notified in writing.
- If a child is still unable to comply, the camp director will host a meeting with parents and execute a behavior contract to be signed by child, parent and program director.
- If a child's behavior continues to be disruptive and or parent/guardians fail to attend meetings and cooperate, the child will be subject to suspension or dismissal from program.

**Behavior or actions which may result in immediate dismissal include, but are not limited to:**

- Any action posing direct threat to the physical/emotional safety of the child, other children or staff.
- Fighting
- Possession of a weapon of any kind
- Vandalism or destruction of property or property of others
- Running away
- Biting
- Stealing

**Illness and Injury**

**Please do not bring your child to camp if they have the following:**

- COVID-19
- Nose that runs constantly
- Undiagnosed rash, sore, or other skin condition
- Excessive coughing
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Fever
- Any contagious disease or symptom
- If a child is injured or ill at camp, he/she will be treated by guidelines established by the American Red Cross. Parents will be notified and will determine whether additional care or consult is required.

- For all minor injuries (scrapes, ant bites, etc.), an "Injury report" is filled out and given to the parents upon pick-up. In the event of severe injury or illness, 911/an ambulance will be called. Parents will be notified in all instances.
- Medication - Parents may bring necessary medication directly to the director. All meds should be in a Ziploc bag with written instruction. A medical log is used to document all medication handed out throughout the day. All meds will be locked in the office. Do not send meds with lunch or snacks.
